The Bird family, artists from the Mulga Bore community, Utopia, Northern Territory, 2018

Karen Bird mainly paints Alvira (or Alparr) seed dreaming.

Alvira (Alparr) seed is a very important food source for Aboriginal people in the Utopia region. Her paintings depict the Alvira (Alparr) seed in different stages of life, and is one of the very sacred dreaming stories. It is also used as a bush medicine, especially for skin cuts and rashes. It is a small, bright green scrubby plant, flowering in May. Her paintings also pick up details of the vivid night sky.

Karen is a significant Utopia artist. Her father is Lindsay Bird, and grandmother is Emily Kame Kngwarreye. Emily was one of Australia's most important Aboriginal artists, and Qantas recently painted their new Dreamliner with one of her famous works. The Bird family were guests of honour when the plane landed in Alice Springs earlier this year, even getting to meet Adam Goodes.



Dave Hall has a direct family connection with the Bird clan. His sister Lisa taught there for five years and was welcomed as one of the family in to the Bird clan. Dave's skin name is Mbitjana.

Karen painted the work (above right) for the PEGS Indigenous Round jumpers 2018. She and her sister Rosie were guests of PEGS in May 2017, spending a week as Artists in Residence.
