Dr. Ree Bodde is the CEO of Think Prevent an organisation providing prosocial behaviour/bystander intervention education and leadership training programs to prevent family violence and violence against women. Dr. Bodde received her PhD from the University of Auckland in 2007.



Glenn Loughrey is a Wiradjuri man from NSW and a Priest at St. Oswald's Anglican Church. He is an artist who fuses Indigenous art styles with Western forms of story telling. He is passionately concerned with Indigenous justice, and a speaker on Reconciliation. He was a semi-finalist for the Doug Moran National Portrait Prize.

Tim McCowan was the founder and Director of the Building Bridges Program, a peacemaking initiative among secondary students from different religious backgrounds. He teaches the Art of Reconciliation, and lectures in the spiritual life at Stirling Theological College.

Our M.C. Rev. Tim Costello is one of Australia's most respected community leaders and a voice for social justice, leadership and ethics. Tim was Chief Exec. of World Vision Australia. He received the Order of Australia, Victorian Australian of the Year and named as one of Australia's 100 National Living Treasures.

Sherene Hassan is the Education Director of the Islamic Museum of Australia. She served as Vice President/Secretary of the Islamic Council of Victoria. The Age newspaper selected her as one of Melbourne's 100 Most Influential People. She has also been 'Muslim Woman of the Year' at the Australian Muslim Achievement Awards.
