We work with the UNSW Indigenous Law Centre (ILC), Australia's oldest and only Indigenous law research centre, that has supported much of the foundational legal and academic work that underpins the Statement.

We are running a national education campaign on an enshrined Voice to Parliament and referendum that is rooted in the ethos and principles of the 1967 referendum – the most successful referendum ever held – when Australians voted a resounding 'yes' to enable the Commonwealth to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
