

## > Blue Christmas 2017







Our Blue Christmas service was offered on **13th December**. We gathered for worship on a very warm evening for a quiet service of reflection & meditation claiming the space to grieve, remember loved ones who have died, look back over a difficult year, seek peace in troubled times or simply take some time away from the busyness of this particular time of the year.

We lit the Advent candles remembering the messages from each week praying for the light of Christ to shine in the darkest places, for peace that is deep and lasting, speaking into the deepest heart of grief, for the gift of Christmas joy, the joy of the Holy Spirit that bubbles up, refreshing our souls, setting us free, and for love grounded in the reality of a harsh and brutal life, fighting for survival, making all the difference.



After listening to the Christmas readings from Isaiah and Luke we created a space to listen, responding to the Advent paintings with words and symbols asking where we do we find hope, peace, joy and love in our grieving and affirmed that the grace of God has appeared in the form of a vulnerable fragile baby who grew to be a man, the one in whom we find hope, peace, joy and love.

lan lit the Christ Candle and offered a time for people to walk, look at and engage with the paintings, taking a card to write or draw on and an opportunity to light tapers from the Christ Candle.

We gathered round the table to celebrate Holy Communion and left quietly, rested in body, mind and soul.





# > Christmas Eve 2017



We gathered before the high & low places of the pageant.

We offered the Meditation from the throne, the fields and the manger.

We listened to the story of the nativity as we sang and prayed in preparation for our celebration of the birth of the Christ child.

We lit the Advent candles for the messages of hope that comes to us in Jesus, of love and comfort that we heard from Isaiah, from John calling us to testify to the light and from the angel telling Mary 'The Lord is with you'.

The Christmas Eve Meditation began before the throne, the place of power remembering that the Christmas story turns this place upside down offering a rebirthing of hope.

In the fields with the shepherds we reflected on the familiarity of our lives and responsibilities and wondered if we are ready for the angels to enter in with a new story, ready to seek the face of Jesus in the lowly ones in the world.

And finally by the manger, the lowly place, a place of love we reflected on our questions, the injustices in the world, the despair that we feel. We named our burdens and laid them by the manger. lan invited 'Come let us walk in this light (as described the prophet Isaiah) from the manger to the world, with hope filled hearts to reshape creation with love.

Later we prayed for people throughout the world receiving the support of the Act for Peace Christmas Bowl Appeal.
