If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. And you know the way to the place where I

No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him."
