GATHERING

Here, we cross a threshold – we move into a sacred space, and a sacred time, a space and time 'set apart' for the purpose of communal prayer.

The worship area is wheelchair accessible.

There is a children's corner with books and activities.

Greeting and Call to Worship

The leader greets the people in God's name and calls us into a worshipful space and state. The bible is carried in and Christ Candle lit – we usually stand (if we are able and comfortable to do so) while this happens.

Good morning, as we gather together to worship God, resting on seats that have supported and shaped communities before ours, let us remember the communities that may have gathered here before this circle of pews was imagined.

Perhaps Myrnong yams were grown here, or grass was slowly burnt and nurtured as food for grazing, feet and arms might have lifted in games or dancing, and those who came before were present in the Dreaming and are still present today.

Take some deep breaths and sense how your body feels to be resting on this ground, part of this community as we prepare to worship together.

Please stand for the Word and the light as we sing together.

HEARING AND RESPONDING

We hear the story of Jesus, Wisdom Incarnate (in the gospels); the story of God's dealings with Israel (in the Old/First Testament); and the story of God's people through history (in Acts and the New Testament letters). As we hear this story, we are reshaped and formed by an alternative perspective on life – the perspective of the gospel, the good news. The story is told through proclamation, which may include reading the Scriptures, reflection on Scripture, symbolic action, art, music, multimedia resources and silence.

Hearing the story requires a response. We respond by making an offering (of ourselves, our gifts, our money, and our prayers for others).

Gospel Reading: Mark 1:14-20

In today's story we hear that Jesus proclaims the 'good news of God'. And it's so amazing that the disciples just up and leave what they are doing and follow Jesus. I can't help but wonder what good news could we hear that would make us change our life direction?

As we continue to make our way through Mark's gospel this year, we will gradually get a picture of what this good news is. And one of the key images is freedom from the things that bind us.

So imagine this net is a collection of things that constrain us like fear, pain, worry, insecurity - others?

We have lots of fish that have been caught, but today we are going to set them free, because the good news that Jesus offers us we do not have to be constrained by, his way of love will set us free.

On each of these fish I have written some words of good news, which we are going to be decorating up the back. During the offering we will be setting them free by handing them back out to you to take home and reflect on during the week.

Listen to that call in silence for a moment.

As we move out into community and as part of the church and other communities of spiritual light, prompt us to your call Jesus to 'drop it all', to pull out, pull away from our grind, roles and false selves. So that God you can guide us to be the fisherfolk, in covenant to be beside the bloodied, the wounded, the grief stricken just as we are all bloodied and wounded ourselves. In fishing for people, we heal ourselves, we find ourselves. Call us loudly and as we call others to be fully present in love and compassion especially those with mental health, aging, loneliness wounds. May we offer presence and model the good news.

Be in silence as we call God to heal and open hearts to the good news of re-turn and turn around.

The world we look at with despair. Yet God you call us to 'fish' as we are, all fisher folk together, called by the wise Christ, to serve and enable the turn around so war will cease. Please God please turn around Israel and Gaza's, Yemen's, Ukraine's powerful players. May all those who kill for land, for ideology having lost the core of simple faith, who act from fear yet manifest terror, control, greed, having to be right, having power over, hear the call and re-pent, re-turn. Help us to be the fishers of folk, calling & acting for a better way, embrace togetherness, letting go of the fear and control. We pray for those fishers of folk who serve in the floods and feel the impacts of climate change. May they know your love & see a re-turn in us as humans so that the Earth becomes Eden again.

Be in silence as we feel the good news penetrating hearts & minds of the powerful and see the re-turn.

In Jesus name we pray. Amen.
