GATHERING

Here, we cross a threshold – we move into a sacred space, and a sacred time, a space and time 'set apart' for the purpose of communal prayer. During the service the congregation is invited to stand and sit for different parts of the service, however you are welcome to stay seated if you wish. A quiet retreat room is available for those who need it. The worship area is wheelchair accessible. There is a children's corner with books and activities.

People are welcomed, those present and those online. The themes of the service are laid out. Welcome to worship here in this space and to all joining us online now or later. I'm Saide, leading worship today with Mick Pope as our preacher, Cath, Kenna, Peter, the musicians led by Natalie and the AV team. Mick is an eco-theologian and member of our congregation. He's a regular on the music roster.

Today is the fourth Sunday in the Season of Lent. We join the Israelites in the desert as they make their complaints against God and we listen to Jesus speaking about being lifted up, about darkness and evil, light and love. In our Lenten questioning Mick will invite us to reflect on turning away from the fear of judgement.

We pray in adoration, praising and adoring God for being God; and in confession, bringing before God the incompleteness and brokenness of the world and our lives. In response we hear God's word of healing grace.

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HEARING AND RESPONDING

We hear the story of Jesus, Wisdom Incarnate (in the gospels); the story of God's dealings with Israel (in the Old/First Testament); and the story of God's people through history (in Acts and the New Testament letters). As we hear this story, we are reshaped and formed by an alternative perspective on life – the perspective of the gospel, the good news. The story is told through proclamation, which may include reading the Scriptures, reflection on Scripture, symbolic action, art, music, multimedia resources and silence. Hearing the story requires a response. We respond by making an offering (of ourselves, our

gifts, our money, and our prayers for others).
