Welcome and Introduction

Safina is a proud Wuthati Country, Mabiaug Island and Aboriginal Spiritual woman living on Bunarong Country. She is the Relationships & Storytelling Coordinator with Common Grace. However due to a family emergency Safina is not able to join us today but hopes to do so in the future. We welcome Mick Pope as our preacher. Mick is a member of our congregation, eco-theologian and meteorologist. Today he will reflect with us on the Sabbath as holy time, time to give rest to creation as we seek to reduce climate chaos. Cath James will preside over our celebration of Holy Communion.

Welcome to worship in this space and all who are joining us online now or later. I'm Saide and have the joyful privilege of leading worship with Mick, Cath, Kenna, Peter, Joanne and the musicians led by Alistair. Our thanks as always to all who support the work of worship behind the scenes is so many generous ways.

Our worship will conclude out in front of the hall on Sydney Road as we ring the bell together to sound the alarm for the climate crisis. Please be ready to move out either through this door behind me or the side door onto Sydney Road. We will sing 'Creator of the great land again' outside and ring the bell. The final blessing will be offered from there.

Prayers of Adoration and Confession

Saide

We pray in adoration, praising and adoring God for being God; and in confession, bringing before God the incompleteness and brokenness of the world and our lives. In response we hear God's word of healing grace.

Imagine the earth as it might have been hundreds upon thousands of years ago, free of the burden of the built environment, free of the weight of pollution and accumulated waste, free to be as God intended, a gift for all.

And it was so. God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. God

set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

Saide God of the day and night, the waters and land you breathed your holy breath and birthed abundance. Your Spirit dances in our souls opening our hearts to your Word, freeing us from apathy. You breathe your holy breath embracing the human and more than human world with love. We adore you.

HEARING AND RESPONDING

We hear the story of Jesus, Wisdom Incarnate (in the gospels); the story of God's dealings with Israel (in the Old/First Testament); and the story of God's people through history (in Acts and the New Testament letters). As we hear this story, we are reshaped and formed by an alternative perspective on life – the perspective of the gospel, the good news. The story is told through proclamation, which may include reading the Scriptures, reflection on Scripture, symbolic action, art, music, multimedia resources and silence.

Hearing the story requires a response. We respond by making an offering (of ourselves, our gifts, our money, and our prayers for others).

Early Word Saide

We've listened to the story of creation from Genesis together this morning. I wonder how often we allow ourselves to take a breath to appreciate the wonder of God's good gift, a sunset, a sunrise, the sound of bird song, the rumble of thunder, the sight and sound of a creek.

Often a moment will catch me by surprise. Ray & I have been going for long bike rides along the Merri Creek in preparation for our Top End (in and around Darwin) cycling holiday. Early on he said to me 'What do you think of the creek?' and I honestly had to answer that I hadn't even been looking. So now I do, and I hope that I will stop and look and appreciate the beauty of all that the small part of the Northern Territory that we'll be visiting has to offer.

So, I invite you to take a moment now and recall something beautiful or wonderful that you have experienced in creation and share it with whoever is sitting near you. Just a few moments.
